We Can All Be a Part of a Community Safety Plan

Dangerous weather events. Public health issues. Terrorism. Sometimes the headlines are enough to make us want to crawl into a cocoon and turn our backs to the world. Fairfax County's Office of Emergency Management (www.fairfaxcounty.gov/emergency/) can help make your community safer and better prepared to respond to the threats of terrorism, crime, public health issues, and disasters of all kinds.

Under the umbrella of the County's Citizen Corps, several volunteer programs are available to county residents. You'll find information about all of the programs below at www.fairfaxcounty.gov/oem/citizencorps/.

Volunteers in Police Service (VIPS)

VIPS volunteers support the police department so that law enforcement professionals have more time for front line duty. VIPS includes auxiliary police officers, administrative volunteers, and the Citizen's Police Academy. Neighborhood Watch

Neighborhood Watch brings residents and police together to reduce neighborhood crime. Residents are trained to identify potential problems and to be alert to any suspicious or unusual activity in the neighborhood. Police officers will also help residents to develop security measures for their own homes.

Medical Reserve Corps (MRC)

You don't have to be a doctor or nurse or have a medical background to volunteer with the Fairfax Medical Reserve Corps (MRC). The Fairfax MRC is an all-volunteer program that supports the public health system to help our community when disaster strikes.

Community Emergency Response Team (CERT)

What would you do if, during a major disaster, you called 9-1-1 and no one responded? The Fairfax County Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) program prepares residents to safely help themselves, their families, and their communities during major emergencies when first responders are delayed.

Instructors from the Fairfax County Fire and Rescue Department and CERT volunteers teach disaster response skills, such as fire suppression, light search and rescue, team organization, and disaster medical operations. In hands-on training, classroom learning, and realistic exercises, CERTs learn how to prepare for disasters, and if a disaster occurs, what to do until professional first responders arrive.

CERTs deploy only during major disasters of such large scale that regular emergency services are overwhelmed (for example, earthquakes or major storms that produce mass casualties), and only to help their neighborhoods and local communities.

Fire Corps Volunteers

These volunteers are trained to perform nonoperational administrative tasks at the Fairfax County Fire and Rescue department headquarters and at local fire stations.

Call for Volunteers (reprinted from last edition)

As many of you know, our Stoneybrooke Neighborhood does not have an official homeowners' association; nor do we have required dues. However, we do have voluntary dues, which pay for *The Sentinel*, among other things. See attachment at the end of this newsletter for more information on membership dues.

More importantly, we have in the past had a very active Community Association, led by volunteers who would take various leadership positions for a few terms, coordinate events within the neighborhood, represent Stoneybrooke in actions outside the neighborhood that may affect the Stoneybrooke community, and hold occasional neighborhood meetings at the Stoneybrooke Mansion to discuss events and activities that affect the community and decide on courses of action.

However, it has been quite a few years since we have had folks who have taken many of these positions, and we have other folks who are still serving but would like someone else to assist or take their place. It would be wonderful if we could have a few volunteers to take these positions, at least for a term or two. None of these necessarily requires much time (recognizing, of course, that any volunteer job can expand depending upon how active you want to be) but each provides significant value to the Stoneybrooke community.

Below are the most important positions that are available. Please give some serious consideration to volunteering for one of these, or at least talking to one of the current or former board/committee members who could provide more information on the position:
