### Message From Supervisor McKay

### A Comprehensive Review of How We Do Business

Despite tough economic times, Fairfax County has worked hard to maintain its reputation for being fiscally responsible and transparent. This is evident by our much-coveted AAA bond rating, the highest credit rating a jurisdiction can obtain. This rating was just reaffirmed by all three rating agencies, thanks to what they cited as strong fiscal policies and effective leadership. Even with such a positive outlook, our Board decided to undertake a comprehensive review of its almost 400 Lines of Business (LOBs) as a means to reevaluate our practices for efficiencies.

LOBs help provide a thorough understanding of the functions and services provided by different agencies in Fairfax. Having this understanding allows staff, the Board of Supervisors, and the community to determine the efficiency, effectiveness, and long-term funding strategies for each of these programs and services.

Each LOB outlines the purpose of a program or service, provides a discussion of relevant challenges and trends, includes opportunities for alternatives, as well as metrics that help illustrate the number of people using a particular service. Beginning in January, agencies began presenting their LOBs to the Board of Supervisors.

In the past eight years, Fairfax County has eliminated more than 700 positions and cut more than \$300 million from our budget. Additional reductions will inevitably impact our ability to address the County's priorities. The LOBs review process will allow us to fully understand the impacts of future budget decisions.

As our Board's new Budget Committee chairman, I want to be sure we are using resources in the most efficient way possibly and that every single dollar we spend is spent wisely towards maintaining the integrity and quality of our community.

The Board of Supervisors will determine next steps following extensive community outreach and internal discussions on our priorities. Ultimately, the Board will discuss a sustainable financial plan to pay for services and invest in the future of Fairfax County. I always welcome your ideas and suggestions on County operations and will provide information as the LOBs process moves forward and community meetings are scheduled. As always, let me know if you have any questions.

## FCPS School Board Approves FY 2017-21 Capital Improvement Program, Including Four New Elementary Schools, One New High School (reprinted by permission)

The Fairfax County School Board voted to approve the Fairfax County Public Schools (FCPS) FY 2017-21 Capital Improvement Program (CIP) at its business meeting on January 21. The FY 2017-21 CIP includes new schools, capacity enhancements, and renovations reflecting a five-year requirement of \$777 million, or roughly \$155 million per year, for new schools and additions, capacity enhancements, and renovations to address current and anticipated enrollment increases. Included in this CIP are plans for four new elementary schools and one high school to relieve overcrowding in existing schools. Funds approved in the 2015 School Bond Referendum and previous referenda will address approximately \$429 million of the five-year requirement, leaving a balance of \$347 million unfunded.

"This CIP addresses some of our critical needs and will help relieve crowding in some of our existing schools," said Board Chair Pat Hynes. "We are particularly challenged by growth in certain areas of the county and higher growth rates among middle and high school students, requiring us to examine a variety of solutions, including temporary classrooms, modular additions, and boundary adjustments. Any boundary adjustments would be discussed and decided with considerable input from the community."



The FY 2017-21 CIP reflects \$310 million approved by county voters in the 2015 School Bond Referendum. Among the funded projects are:

- A gym for Bailey's Upper Elementary School for the Arts and Sciences.
- A new elementary school in the Route 1 area to alleviate crowding in the Groveton-Hybla Valley area of the county.
- An expansion and renovation to Fort Belvoir Elementary School.
- Additions to South Lakes High School and Westbriar Elementary School.
- Three modular addition relocations.

Unfunded projects include a new elementary school in the northwest part of the county (planning is funded, construction is unfunded), an elementary school in the Fairfax-Oakton area, a high school in the western part of the county near the end of Metro's Silver Line, additions to two high schools and one middle school, and one modular addition relocation.

Funding for capital improvement projects is currently limited by a \$155 million yearly cap on school bond sales. Additional funding sources include \$13.1 from the Fairfax County Board of Supervisors for infrastructure management, and a grant from the U.S. Department of Defense that will fund 80 percent of the cost of upgrades to the existing Fort Belvoir Elementary School and a construction of a new school on an adjacent site.
