VDOT has published their 2017 NoVA paving map, which is now viewable on the **VDOT website**. A paving schedule has not yet been released, but exact work dates will be available about ten days prior to work beginning. Paving typically takes place during non-rush hour times. Among the major Richmond Hwy area roads scheduled to be repaved include Mount Vernon Memorial Hwy, North Kings Hwy, South Kings Hwy, Telegraph Rd, Rose Hill Dr.

Huntington Farmers Market back for third season. The market, located near the North Kings Hwy entrance to the Huntington Metro Station, opened April 27th and is open every Thursday from 3pm to 7pm. For more information on the vendors, see the **Smart Markets webpage**. The McCutcheon/Mount Vernon farmers market, the only other Richmond Hwy-area market, opened May 3rd. - *Covering the Corridor*

VDOT lays out basics of Richmond Hwy widening. The project will widen the highway from four to six lanes between Jeff Todd Way and Napper Rd. The project will also inlcude 6 1/2-foot wide asphalt bike lanes on each side, 6-foot wide concrete sidewalks on each side, and a 58-foot wide median section so that Bus Rapid Transit can later be added as part of the Embark Richmond Hwy initiative. Construction is still years away, wth an estimated completion date in 2026. Advisory group and community meetings are being held to discuss the project.
