Letter from the Board

Hard to believe that the holiday season has come and gone and that we are nearly a month into 2019. Hopefully everyone was able to take some time to spend with family and friends, reflect on the accomplishments of the past year, and chart their own personal course of how to make this next year even better.

The area experienced the first measurable snowfall of the winter recently. How can we help ourselves when inclement weather comes in?

Clearing the roads: The County did a pretty good job of getting the roads cleared despite the recent storm delivering on the top end of the accumulation prediction. If you are able to move your vehicles off of the roadway and into the driveway, it creates a larger area for the plows to operate, thus creating wider and clearer lanes. It also helps to keep the treatments where they are supposed to be...on the pavement and not on the side of your vehicle.

Sidewalks: At the first opportunity, do your best to get your sidewalk cleared...and if you know of somebody who cannot do theirs, go the extra mile and give them a hand. We have many in the neighborhood who depend on the sidewalks to move about safely...especially our school-kids who have to get to one of the designated bus stops. Often times, FCPS will close the schools not because of the roads, but because of the sidewalks.

Safe speeds: A friendly reminder to monitor your speed as you move through the neighborhood. Gravity and a reluctance to ride our brakes causes us to naturally gain speed and momentum going down the hill. Just keep in mind that one of the things that makes our neighborhood great is that it is not a thoroughfare between Kings Highway and Route 1, meaning that nearly everyone moving about has a vested interest in the safety of our community.

Security: As a community, we must all maintain our vigilance. This is everything from keeping your vehicles and valuable secured, proper lighting, looking out for one another, and generally just being a good neighbor. But sometime reporting, and re-reporting may be the only solution...the proverbial "squeaky wheel". Security is one of the top concerns of the board and several ideas will be discussed in the near future.

Lime Electric Scooters Approved for Nine-Month Pilot Program in Alexandria

San Francisco-based dockless electric scooter and electric bike operator Lime has received a permit from the city of Alexandria, Virginia — the first operator to win approval there as part of a nine-month pilot program. The Alexandria City Council approved the pilot in November. The city is accepting permit applications from other operators in addition to Lime. The pilot program will evaluate the safety and popularity of dockless scooters and bikes and the performance of companies that enroll in the pilot. Alexandria is also soliciting public input during the nine-month pilot.

A Reminder about Recycling Rules and Guidelines

The biggest problem facing the recycling industry is contamination caused by the wrong items being thrown into recycling carts. No need to collect your recyclables using plastic bags. This makes it harder to process. Let your recyclables run loose in the cart! Recycle plastic bags at the grocery store. Here are some simple rules to follow to avoid contamination and to make sure your recycling is put to good future use:

- Rinse and remove any remaining food or liquid contents from your recyclables.
- NO plastic bags, NO takeout containers, NO diapers, NO pizza boxes, NO Styrofoam, NO packaging peanuts, NO Clamshell containers either Styrofoam or clear plastic.

Residential properties can recycle the following materials:

- Mixed paper and flattened cardboard
- Glass bottles and jars
- Metal food and beverage cans
- Cartons (milk, juice) remove caps and straws
- Plastic food and beverage bottles, jugs, tubs.
