Letter from the Board

In the span of 388 days, The Virginia Cavaliers men's basketball team moved from one end of the spectrum to the other in sports history. Going into the 2018 NCAA Tournament, a #16 seed had never beaten a #1 seed in the opening round but someone failed to tell the University of Maryland, Baltimore County that. In a stunning upset, the Cavs sealed their infamy in a 74-54 loss to a Retriever squad that simply could not miss. Fast forward a year later and following improbable comeback wins against Purdue and Auburn, Virginia was able to best Texas Tech in overtime to take the 2019 championship. It looks like another winter has come and gone through Northern Virginia and we now prepare for the April and May afternoon rain showers and thunderstorms that will usher in the summer. As the lawns turn green and the trees start to bud, keep the following in mind.

With spring clean-up and mowers being fired up, yard waste can become an issue. Fairfax County defines yard waste as grass clippings, leaves, and brush (i.e., branches and twigs smaller than four-feet in length) generated during general yard maintenance. While they encourage recycling on-site whenever possible (mulching or composting), they also offer curbside pick-up. While there is no regulatory guidance prohibiting the use of plastic bags, they do recommend the use of the brown paper lawn bags or reusable plastic bins. Ensure that you check with your trash removal provider to make sure they don't have any additional restrictions. Fairfax County is offering free rides throughout April on a new bus route that runs from the Franconia-Spring-field Metro through Kingstowne to Inova Mount Vernon Hospital. The new Route 308 began running on March 30. It connects Richmond Highway to Kingstowne via Jeff Todd Way, and includes a stop at the Hilltop Village Center — home to Wegmans — as well as Springfield Town Center, Manchester Lakes Shopping Center, Mount Vernon Plaza and the Gum Springs Center.

Other stops include the South County Government Center, the Mount Vernon Governmental Center and Sherwood Regional Library.

New Domestic Violence Shelter Opens

Earlier this month Artemis House Region 1, a domestic violence shelter located in the Richmond Highway area, opened. Previously, Fairfax County had two domestic violence shelters: Artemis House in northern Fairfax County and Bethany House in central Fairfax County. The shelters have undisclosed locations to give domestic violence victims safe and secure shelter while they work on longer-term living arrangements. It also provides a safe location to begin recovery from trauma.

Artemis House accepts men, women, people who identify as transgender and children. Adults and children staying at Artemis House have access to case management services and counseling. Residents also receive transportation assistance and emergency food and clothing if needed.

Tall Ship Providence to Dock at City Marina for Year

City Council is set to consider the short-term agreement for Tall Ship Providence, a replica of the Navy's first warships arriving in Alexandria this summer. Under the short-term agreement, the Tall Ship Providence Foundation would dock the ship at the Alexandria City Marina's G/H Pier for one year. The ship is being restored currently and could sail into Alexandria in mid-June. The ship could open to the public in July.

Once the ship is open, visitors can climb aboard and learn about 18th century life on the sea and the history of the original ship, and meet a John Paul Jones reenactor. Weekly sails, craft brew cruises with Port City Brewing Company and private tours will further bolster entertainment offerings on the waterfront.

Tall Ship Providence is known for appearances in "Pirates of the Caribbean." A descendant of the original ship built the replica in 1976 for America's Bicentennial. The Tall Ship Providence Foundation purchased it from Rhode Island.

Mirror Mirror Installation Open at New Waterfront Park

Mirror Mirror, a site-specific, temporary installation will activate the new expansion of Waterfront Park from through November 2019. The project aims to encourage visitors to experience art and explore and enjoy the new public plaza and civic space.

The artwork takes the form of an opened circle, 25-feet in diameter and approximately 8 feet high, that visitors can walk inside and around. Playing with the ideas of reflection and refraction of light, *Mirror Mirror*'s interior and exterior are clad with a mirrored surface that reflects the surrounding environment in unexpected ways. The artwork is also programmed to respond to sound with light, allowing visitors to interact with the artwork and affect its appearance using their voices and bodies.

Mirror Mirror is located in the expanded area of Waterfront Park at the foot of King Street, adjacent to the Torpedo Factory Art Center and the existing Waterfront Park.
