Letter from the Board

Despite temperatures and rain that has kept our lawns lush and green through summer, it looks like autumn has finally arrived. The oranges and reds are beginning to show on the trees and, while mowing yesterday, I noticed the leaves are beginning to accumulate on the lawn. Keeping with the Halloween spirit, the pumpkins, ghouls and goblins are beginning to show up in the neighborhood as is the pleasant aroma of a warm fire of an evening.

As the leaves begin to fall and over take the yards and streets, this is a good time to talk refuse collection. While lots of information is available on the Fairfax County website, Stoneybrooke residents rely on private trash collection services who all have their own timelines and separate days for leaf and yard debris pick-up. Also, keep in mind that Fairfax County no longer takes yard waste in plastic bags. The recommendation is to use either a plastic bin or the paper lawn and leaf collection bags available at the local home improvement store. Regardless of who your provider is and how you choose to maintain your property, take the extra few minutes to look for common areas that you can put a little effort into. Most important are the curbs and the pathways to the sewers. The geography of our neighborhood allows for gravity to do most of the work in moving out rainwater but leaves, sticks and other debris can greatly impact the free flow into the sewers. It doesn't take much...or very long for organic material to accumulate and effectively dam up the free flow of water.

Speaking of, Fairfax County has a campaign to help improve local surface water quality by working to reduce residential water pollution. The most common sources of residential pollution are:

- Swimming pool discharges
- Vehicle washing and maintenance
- Excessive animal waste
- Improper yard waste disposal
- Unsecured garbage and trash
- Improper pesticide application
- Construction materials and paint

Did you know? The Fairfax County storm drainage system, known as the Municipal Separate Storm Sewer System (MS4) carries stormwater to nearby ponds, streams, lakes, and rivers. Please do not dump anything down the storm drains. Do not rake or dump grass clippings or leaves into the storm drainage system. Never dump treated swimming pool water, pet waste, used motor oil, paint, chemicals or other substances into a storm drain. Secure garbage on collection days to avoid litter reaching the stormwater system.

Art on the Avenue is Back

Dozens of artists will line Mount Vernon Avenue in Del Ray on Saturday, Oct. 2 from 10 a.m. - 6 p.m. The popular event draws artists in more than 10 categories from food and books to sculpture, painting, bath and body products and more. In addition, attendees can enjoy music, visit the kid's art corner and support local restaurants and businesses. In the past, the event has brought out 300 artists and 50,000 visitors. Stuff The Bus Food Drive Next Weekend

Since 2011, Stuff the Bus food drives have been held as a way to replenish local food pantries during times when donations drop off. The events are typically held after the summer and winter holidays. A partnership between Fairfax County and local nonprofits, Stuff the Bus has collected over 220 tons of food.

Fastran buses will be on site for donation drop-offs at 19 locations across Fairfax County from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. on Oct. 9. The food pantry benefiting from the donations will vary by location. Another location for nonperishable food donations will be South Lakes High School PTSA Food Pantry at Good Shepherd Lutheran Church, 1133 Reston Avenue, Herndon, VA.

Residents can stop by any Stuff the Bus location on Oct. 9 or make a monetary donation on Volunteer Fairfax's Stuff the Bus Donation Page. Monetary donations can help nonprofits purchase more food in bulk or with special discounts from retailers, as well as provide culturally appropriate foods and fresh foods, and keep food pantries stocked when donations drop. Tour de Mount Vernon Set for Late October

The annual Tour de Mount Vernon returns this fall on Oct. 23. The bike ride offers a tour of the Mount Vernon District of Fairfax County, while offering participants the chance to ask questions at various sites and connect with other local residents. The route will start and end at the Woodlawn & Pope-Leighey House.

GW Parkway to Go on a 'Road Diet' in October

In early October, the National Park Service (NPS), which runs the George Washington Memorial Parkway, will start putting that road on a diet. The restriping program will alter lane configurations in an effort to make the Parkway safer for drivers, pedestrians and bicyclists.

The NPS will restripe the road between the City of Alexandria and George Washington's Mount Vernon Estate to create just one southbound lane instead of two, a turning lane and two northbound lanes between Stratford Lane (near Mount Vernon Estate) and Tulane Drive (just south of Belle View).

In addition, new signs and flexible posts will be installed where the Parkway intersects with Belle View Boulevard and Belle Haven Drive. Other intersections will also see changes, including cutting back vegetation to improve driver's sightlines and more visible crosswalk markings.

Aslin Beer Co. Opens New Scratch Kitchen in Alexandria

Aslin is opening a new scratch kitchen concept called Knead. Knead will feature large round pizza, individual Sicilian-style slices and sandwiches on house-made bread. Salads and sides will also be on the menu, and the popular Korean-style chicken sandwich and double-stack Smash burger will return.

Knead will be operating Wednesday through Sunday at Aslin, 847 S. Pickett St., in Alexandria.

South County Teen and Senior Centers Opens at the Original Mount Vernon High School

On September 22, about 50 community members gathered for a ribbon-cutting ceremony celebrating the opening of the South County Teen and Senior Centers at the Original Mount Vernon High School.

The OMVHS master development planning process was concluded in fall 2019. Following early proposed redevelopment concepts for renovations, a mix of new residential development, and additional public facilities, the county determined to focus on a phased approach to redevelopment that would align with the EMBARK and Bus Rapid Transit project along the Richmond Highway Corridor, which is in the planning phase. As such, the priority for the redevelopment work has been placed on the renovations and adaptive reuse of the historic high school and related site work as Phase I of the overall redevelopment.

The overarching vision of Phase I is to leverage the former high school to build communities of opportunity, create career pathways, connect different generations and better integrate residents into the economy. The renovated high school will be suitable for educational, childcare and childhood education programs; art, recreational, and life skill training programs; and innovation and business incubation spaces.
