Inova Deploys Urgent Care At-Home Service

Inova healthcare is partnering with DispatchHealth to launch on-demand, urgent healthcare at home local residents.

For injuries and illnesses that do not require an emergency room visit but can't wait a few days for a doctor's appointment, healthcare professionals from DispatchHealth will come to your home. Services include those for:

- Viral infections including COVID-19 and Influenza
- COPD exacerbations
- Congestive heart failure
- Minor fractures, sprains, strains, and bruises
- Pneumonia
- And more.

To request care, patients can call 571-393-1944, visit DispatchHealth.com or download a free mobile app. A doctor's referral is not required. Once requested, an emergency care-trained DispatchHealth medical team that includes a nurse practitioner or physician associate, along with a medical technician, will arrive at the patient's home to treat the patient.

For life-threatening and time-sensitive injuries and illnesses, patients should call 911 or go to the nearest emergency room. DispatchHealth shouldn't be used in a life-threatening emergency, and it doesn't replace a primary care provider, Inova cautioned.

Sudshare App-Based Laundry Service Launches in Alexandria

Sudshare has launched in Alexandria to connect people who hate washing clothes (or don't have time to do it) with people who are willing to do it for you.

"Sudshare is like Uber, but for laundry," the company explained. "The app connects people who have piles of laundry but no time with people who have time and want to turn their washer/dryer into a work-from-home gig."

For just \$1 per pound, Sudshare "sudsters" will pick up, wash, dry, fold and return your clothes within 24 hours. You may include special instructions. Sudster washes in cold water with Tide, Kirkland or Persil detergent unless you request otherwise.

More Travel Changes Could Come to Richmond Highway

As local residents adjust to some major changes along the George Washington Memorial Parkway, local and state officials are considering another significant adjustment to a major road.

"In response to the community's concerns about the speed on Richmond Highway - our Main Street - I, along with other local officials, requested that the Virginia Department of Transportation (VDOT) and the Fairfax County Department of Transportation (FCDOT) conduct a speed study to determine if the speed limit on this roadway is appropriate, or if it should be decreased," wrote Fairfax County District Supervisor Dan Storck in an email to residents.

"While I am supportive of reducing the speed limit on our Main Street, I am very interested in the study findings and hearing from each of you about this important safety issue. The lowering of the speed limit may also prevent the need for sound walls along the corridor," he continued.

The speed limit along Richmond Highway is 45 mph, and the study area goes between Belvoir Road/Meade Road at the southern end and I-95/I-495 Capital Beltway on the northern end.

The goal of lowering the speed would be for the safety of all commuters, including pedestrians and bicyclists.

The potential changes to Richmond Highway come on the heels of a "road diet" completed along the GW Parkway earlier this fall. The changes reduce the number of vehicular travel lanes in an effort to make turning easier, increase safety and decrease the number of accidents.

Not all residents are happy with the changes, saying the Parkway is harder to navigate, and some left turns from side streets onto the Parkway are now nearly impossible.

Golf to Return to Former TopGolf in Kingstowne?

The former TopGolf in Kingstowne and adjacent Ruby Tuesday, also closed, could reopen as a new venue called Rudy's, according to a report by Washington Business Journal.

In many ways, Rudy's would be similar to TopGolf and could even use technology owned by TopGolf that tracks balls from your club to the hole. The other half of the facility would be a restaurant.

The TopGolf location was the company's first location when it opened in 2005.

The property owner filed plans with the Fairfax County government several years ago to replace Topgolf Alexandria with townhomes, multifamily units and commercial space. Those plans are on hold, but they aren't totally off the table.

The restaurant serves Peruvian-style charbroiled chicken which is marinated for 24 hours before it is roasted and served with a variety of sides like plantains, fries, rice, or veggies. The restaurant also serves other traditional dishes including ceviche, carne asada, pescado frito and more.

The new location is currently under construction and an opening date has not been announced.
