#### Letter from the Board

Hello again, Stoneybrooke neighbors!

It's hard to believe, but Spring is just around the corner and things are already heating up in Stoneybrooke! We kicked off 2024 with a celebration of our newly minted neighborhood nonagenarian, Ms. Jo Butler. Neighbors gathered on a chilly February afternoon to toast to her good health with tasty treats and food truck favorites.

We also entered our new fiscal year, and membership dues are flooding in. As you may recall, our Stoneybrooke Citizens Association (SCA) board has committed to growing our membership over the next three years. In last month's edition of the Sentinel, we published the following motion, passed in January by the board:

"The board will promote to the community a goal of growing the household membership in the SCA and put into place actions to achieve this growth. Our goal is 70 households in 2024, 80 households in 2025, and 90 households in 2026."

Our membership drive to reach that goal is well underway after launching with a direct mailer that was delivered to all Stoneybrooke residents in February. We hope you have received your mailer by now and have chosen to renew your membership. Thank you to those who have already paid. If you have not, we ask that you renew your membership by March 30<sup>th</sup>.

We have some fun upcoming events lined up for you as well. Food trucks from Hangry Panda and Sugarcoated Bakery will be coming Thursday, March 14<sup>th</sup>. Check the Facebook page for more information as the date approaches and be sure to bring your appetites! Finally, our annual Easter Egging event will be Saturday, March 30<sup>th</sup>. ## **Easter Egging Returns in 2024**



## Virginia Legislature Votes to Approve Marijuana Sales, Awaits Governor's Decision

The vote, passed last Wednesday, would create the legal framework for retail sales, including provisions for localities to allow or prohibit sales by referendum. Marijuana possession was decriminalized in 2021 but sales of the drug remained illegal. The new bill will now go to the Governor's desk for signature or veto.

### **Fairfax Connector Strike Continues**

The Fairfax Connector bus service is halted as contract talks continue between the 600 operators and mechanics of Amalgamated Transit Union Local 689, and the Transdev company, responsible for operating the Fairfax Connector service. ATU leaders allege unfair labor practices and want higher pay, better benefits. The 26,000 residents relying on the Connector each day will have to find alternate transportation as the strike continues.

## Fairfax County Middle Schools Consider Later Star Time

A possible change to middle school start times could come as soon as the 2025-26 school year. Currently, all middle schools in the district start at 7:30 a.m. Now, the county wants to have them start at or after 8 a.m.. Now the question becomes how to implement this without significant changes to budgets or scheduling. Consulting firm Prismatic Services will use the next 10 months to establish a recommendation for the school board, which is expected to be presented in January.
