Tickets to the Aug. 17 festival are \$10 in advance and can be purchased online. Proceeds from the event will benefit Lucky Dog Animal Rescue and the Animal Welfare League of Alexandria.

Wegmans Breaks Ground in Hoffman Town Center

Wegmans will be building an 84,000 square-foot store in Alexandria near the Hoffman Town Center off of Eisenhower Avenue. The grocery store is part of a mixed-use project on the 5-acre site, according to developer StoneBridgeCarras. Much of the Wegmans will be on the second floor of the development. The project will also several hundred residential units. With an aggressive construction timeline, the project is estimated to be completed by 2022. Wegmans has not announced an opening date.

ALDI to Replace Closed Kingstowne Toys R Us

An ALDI grocery store will open at 6001 Kingstowne Village Parkway, according to permits filed with Fairfax County to make alterations to the space. The space was formerly occupied by Toys "R" Us, which closed all 700 of its toy stores across the country two years ago.

There are currently about a dozen ALDI stores in Northern Virginia, including two in Alexandria's West End (at a former Magruder's location and former Mango Mike's restaurant location), one in Del Ray that opened in 2016 and one on Richmond Highway. Another ALDI will be opening in the former Babies R Us space in Bailey's Crossroads.

No word yet on an opening date. Most ALDI grand openings include lots of coupons for free items for the first 100 shoppers.

New Apartment Building Neighbor Planned for Huntington Metro

A developer has applied to build a new seven-story, 379-unit apartment on a vacant spot next to the Huntington Metro. While the land is zoned for mixed-use, the new building will be residential only and have a 530-space parking garage.

The Bethesda-based SK+1 is the architect for the project and has designed a number of residential and mixed-use buildings throughout the D.C. area, including The Parkeron Huntington Avenue and Modera Mosaic in Merrifield's Mosaic District.

The land the new apartment building will be built borders the south garage at the Huntington Metro station and the Courts at Huntington Station. It had long been home to a 1940s-era single-family house that last served as a Metro Transit Police substation.
