Letter from the Board

The Haunting of Yacht Haven

One home tucked away in a quiet neighborhood in the Mount Vernon area has its own small-scale, free and family-friendly haunted house scene called: "The Haunting of Yacht Haven."

Wade and Lisa Woolwine — both fans of horror movies and the supernatural — first conceived their front-yard Halloween display when they lived on North Kings Highway. New Japanese Restaurant opens in Belle View Shopping Center

Yido Ramen & Sushi opened earlier in October in the Belle View Shopping Center. Yido's menu boasts an extensive array of sushi choices, as well as Japanese and Chinese-style ramen. There are also lunch specials and a sushi bar. Yido replaces Magic Wok Cafe, which closed in April. The new tenants have completely renovated the interior.

New Animal Hospital Opens at Telegraph Shops

A new animal hospital on South Kings Highway is aiming to make your pet's trip to the vet a less stressful. Harmony Animal Hospital, which opened in late September, features a brand-new, state-of-the-art interior specifically designed to reduce the anxiety level of your cat and dog. The building features separate entrances and waiting rooms for cats and dogs. There are textured floors so dogs don't have to worry about slipping. Even the paint scheme and the colors of the uniforms worn by the staff are meant to be as pet-friendly as possible. The hospital also has the basics, including surgery and dentistry areas, X-ray rooms, a pharmacy, and recovery areas for cats and dogs. There's also some nice touches for pet owners, including comfortable furniture and free coffee that's provided by the popular Grounded Coffee shop around the corner. Cat and dog food and treats are also available for sale.

Harmony Animal Hospital is located at 6940 South Kings Highway in the Telegraph Shops at Telegraph Village shopping center.

Virginia Hills Baptist Church Plans to Expand with Senior Housing

Virginia Hills Baptist Church has partnered with a senior living developer to build a 170-unit facility for seniors on the church's property. Virginia Hills Baptist and Brightview Senior Living submitted their rezoning request for the project to Fairfax County in August, which includes plans to build a 194,000-square-foot continuing care development on the church's property. Brightview Virginia Hills, as the facility is referred to, would feature both independent living and assisted living residences. The current church and its daycare facility would remain on the site but would be rebuilt toward the front of the property. The senior residences would be closer to the center and rear of the property, which borders Lee District Park to the east and south, and a residential development to the north. Thirty-six units of the facility would be for residents with dementia and other memory impairment, such as Alzheimer's disease.

Wawa is coming...to Beacon Hill

Wawa has applied for multiple construction permits to renovate the former Rite Aid store at 6711 Richmond Highway. Permits indicate that Wawa plans to update the building's facade and make structural and other improvements to the existing building as part of the project.

An initial zoning review has already been approved by the county, according to the permits. It does not appear Wawa has applied to put gas pumps at the site; a special exception requiring approval from the Board of Supervisors would be needed for that.

Wawa has developed a loyal fanbase, particularly for its variety of food and coffee options. In the past year the chain has aggressively expanded in the D.C. market, with new locations in Tenleytown and Columbia Heights opening earlier this year and another in Northwest scheduled to open later this fall.

Small Shopping Center to Possibly Replace Two Rundown Houses on Route 1

The two homes, located at 8212 and 8118 Richmond Highway, are proposed to be demolished to make way for a 9,200-square-foot shopping center. The shopping center would consist of two 4,600-square-foot buildings, with a driveway that intersects with Richmond Highway separating the two buildings. Parking would be in the rear of the center, behind the buildings. An outdoor seating area would be allowed in front of the buildings should a restaurant or restaurants move into the spaces.

The two lots were last used as a rental car facility and a title loan business, respectively. The title loan business has been closed since 2017, and in 2018 the windows of the other building were boarded up after the car rental business moved. As of last week, the front area of the homes was overgrown and some vehicles remain in the rear of the lot. Neither house appears to have been used in some time.
