Letter from the Board

Another "winter" has come and gone, it seems, for the Stoneybrooke community. Above normal temperatures and below normal snow days had us reaching more for our sweaters and sweatshirts than winter coat and gloves. The warmer days accompanied by longer daylit evenings have more residents out on walks or other outdoor activities. It is incredibly easy to not notice one's speed while driving down our neighborhood hills, please continue to keep safety and vehicle speed in mind as you are out and about. Please keep a close eye out for residents that are out and enjoying the weather in our great neighborhood.

Humans aren't the only ones shaking off the winter doldrums and getting out and about. Four legged ones, and even worse, the "no-legged" ones like snakes could become more active as spring matures. Deer and fox sightings are rather common and there is a reasonable expectation for groundhogs, skunks, possums as well as snakes. Un-less any of them pose a direct and immediate threat to your safety, the recommended guidance is just to leave them alone.

Perhaps take advantage of the nice weather and clear your yard of anything that may attract unwanted visitors. Leaves, tree limbs and any other debris that has accumulated can provide an attractive residence. For your organic waste, Fairfax County is working to transition away from plastic bags for collection. The recommendation is for residents to use the compostable paper bags available at local home improvement stores or in a rigid container that is clearly marked. Lee-Fendall House Easter Egg Hunt

The museum's garden will be filled with hundreds of colorful, toy-filled Easter eggs. Other activities include games, crafts, refreshments and photos with the Easter Bunny. All children ages 12 and under are eligible to participate in the Easter Egg Hunt. Older children and adults are welcome to enjoy our other activities.

Admission to the Easter egg hunt is \$15 (\$10 for members) for children ages 1-12; \$5 (free for members) for adults; free for infants under 1 years old; discounted tickets are available for Friends of the Lee-Fendall House. The Christmas Attic Closes Its Doors

One of Alexandria's most beloved businesses, The Christmas Attic at 125 S. Union St., has closed its doors after nearly 50 years in business near the Alexandria waterfront.

The year-round winter wonderland offered a special shopping experience, a stop for the young and youngat-heart, punctuated with an antique model train that looped on a track above shoppers browsing through ornaments and nutcrackers.

The family-owned boutique has been a part of Alexandria's holiday tradition for years, opening in 1971. Inside the historic shop, in a building that dates to the 1800s, you could step into a wonderland of the holidays spread out over two floors.

French Inspired Café to Open in Old Town

A new family and veteran-owned business is coming to the first floor of 215 S. Union St.

The café will serve manually brewed coffee from Counter Culture, a Durham, North Carolina- based coffee roasting company that provides sustainable coffee and develops strong partnerships with small farmers and café owners.

Customers can drop by for a quick breakfast or lunch or stay and hang out.

The location of the café was formerly occupied by B Doughnut, which closed in March 2019 after being open less than a year. The building is also home to Praha Beads and Jewelry and Grit Studio Kris Clark Hair and Makeup on the second floor.

The café is scheduled to open in mid-March.

Unique and Special Kids Spa moving to Groveton

The Unique and Special Kids Spa in Hybla Valley is moving to a new location in Groveton at the end of the month. Currently located in the Sherwood Crossing shopping center at 7910 Andrus Road, the U.S. Kids Spa will be moving to the office building at 6911 Richmond Highway.

The U.S. Kids Spa opened in October 2018 at the Andrus Road location. It caters to children between the ages of 3 and 15, according to its website. The spa has mini-mani and mini-pedi services starting at \$25 as well as party packages ranging between \$425 and \$575.

Belle View Shopping Center Redevelopment Nomination Submitted

Nominations submitted in the 2019-2020 South County Site-Specific Plan Amendment Process include a redevelopment proposal for the Belle View Shopping Center. That proposal calls for a mixed-use development to replace the shopping center, which had been constructed in 1959.

The nomination request for the Belle View Shopping Center calls for replacing the 182,000-square-foot retail strip with a mixed-use space including grocery store, retail, multifamily residential and townhouses.

By putting forward this nomination request, the Owner of the Property seeks to transform the property into a vibrant mixed-use neighborhood for its foreseeable future. Simply put, the goal is to ensure the Shopping Center remains the "living room" for the community for decades to come.

The nomination review phase is expected to happen from March to April 2020. The Planning Commission would hold a public hearing in June on the task forces' recommendations and decide which nominations will be added to the Comprehensive Plan Amendment Work Program. The Board of Supervisors would consider the revised Comprehensive Plan Amendment Work Program in July. Nominations on the standard track for approval could go to the Planning Commission for hearings as early as May 2021 and Board of Supervisors in June 2021.

County Officially moving away from plastic bags for yard waste

Fairfax County is asking residents to stop using plastic bags for yard waste collection and begin moving to compostable paper bags or reusable containers.

The county had already encouraged residents to not use plastic bags for yard waste, but last week the Board of Supervisors voted to begin transitioning away from plastic bags completely. A formal code change will be voted on by the BOS at a later time, according to a county press release.

For now, plastic bags will still be accepted if you leave them at the curb, and the county did not specifically say when they will stop accepting yard waste in plastic bags. However, it will not be before next year, according to a county press release.

The change will apply to all county residents regardless of whether the county picks up their yard waste or if private companies do so. The county website now has a Frequently Asked Questions page for residents on other questions they might have regarding the transition (no, you cannot blow your leaves into the street).
